Bread From Heaven

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January 1

"I am that bread of life."- John 6:48

Jesus said "Man shall not live by bread alone," and yet he said he is "the bread of life."- This may seem like a contradiction, but the first bread mentioned is made with hands, baked in an oven, to feed our bodies. The second bread of life' is a picture of our Savior, and Christians are said to be feeding on his Word. Everyone filled with this bread will live forever. John 6:33

January 2

"The LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul."- Genesis 2:7

This wonderful verse tells us exactly how God made the first human being, Adam. He made his flesh and bones out of the dust of the ground. That body could not move; it was not alive. Then God caused air to go into Adam's nostrils, and he was alive. Adam was not given a soul; he became a living soul. Ezekiel 18:4

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January 3

“He stretches out the north over the empty place, and hangs the earth upon nothing.”- Job 26:7

Science proves the Bible; and here is a good example. Job told us long ago that the earth hangs upon nothing, which describes the earth in orbit around the sun. The Bible tells of scientific things, rather than explaining them. It is descriptive and poetic, and in that sense, incredibly beautiful. Psalm 104:5

January 4

“Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow.”- Matthew 6:28

Take a flower in your hand. Note its lovely shape, its delicate perfume and color. God gave us hundreds of beautiful flowers, with a variety of fragrances and hues. He gives us more than we can think of or ask for. We have nothing to offer in return for his love but our hearts and reverence, and he lovingly accepts these. Luke 12:7

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January 5

“That which befalls (happens to) the sons of man befalls beasts: ... as the one dies, So dies the other All go unto one place; all are of the dust, and all turn to dust again.”- Ecclesiastes 3:19,20

So far as this present life is concerned, man has no advantage over the animals. “All is vanity [unsatisfactory, Strongs],” and all die and return to dust. But man does have a great advantage over the animals because Jesus gave his life a ransom for all mankind, and So we are assured of an awakening from death. Ecclesiastes 9:10

January 6

“Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needs not to be ashamed.”-2 Timothy 2:15

We study the Bible to learn the many things we need to know in order to serve God. It is a privilege to look for his will and to do it to the best of our ability. The word workman suggests the thought of being engaged in service. One way we can do this is to tell others of God’s loving plan for all the world of mankind, to be brought about in due time. 2 Timothy 3:16,17

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January 7

“Study to show thyself approved unto God, ... rightly dividing the Word of truth.”-2 Timothy 2:15

In the Bible there are many things which were true long ago (history), others that are true now, and still others that will be true at a later date (prophecy). We need to be able to understand which time period is being mentioned, in order to understand the messages God gives us in the Scriptures. Ecclesiastes 3:1

January 8

Jesus “was the true light, which lights every man that comes into the world.”- John 1:9

Jesus himself said, “I am the light of the world.”- He also said to his disciples, “Ye are the light of the world.”- The only true light shines forth from God through our Savior’s teachings and example. Though only some are enlightened by a knowledge of God’s plans now, in the kingdom of Christ, the light of truth will shine on, or reach, everyone. 2 Corinthians 4:6

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January 9

“The fear [reverence] of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom.”- Psalms 111:10

Strong's Concordance gives the meaning for fear as 'reverence, which means 'to regard with deep respect'. When we regard our Heavenly Father with awe and esteem, he will begin to work in our lives, revealing himself and his purposes for the perfection of all mankind. This is the true wisdom we should seek: the understanding of God's character, plan and teachings. Job 28:28

January 10

“Without faith it is impossible to please him (God); for he that comes to God must believe that he is.”- He 11:6

God asks us to look around at his marvelous creation. All this: the earth, the universe, all of what we call nature, was made by our Heavenly Father, Jehovah. Mark 11:22

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January 11

*God "is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him."-
Hebrews 11:6*

Diligently means 'carefully'. If anyone earnestly looks for God and his truth, God will see that he or she finds him. People who are satisfied with errors about God's character and plans will be left with these errors; they will not find the truth. Lamentations 3:25

January 12

*"Seek ye out of the Book of the LORD and read."-
Isaiah 34:16*

We learn God's plan by studying the Bible by topics. Only in this way will God's Word be harmonious and logical. God has given us several objects for studying the Bible: So he will approve of us and we will know what work he wants us to do; So when asked, we may give a reason for the hope that is in us; and So we may understand his plans and purposes. 2 Timothy 2:15

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January 13

“God is faithful.”-1 Corinthians 1:9

God's promises always come true; he never fails. Sometimes we have to wait a long time before we can see clearly what his will for us may be, but he never forgets us. The delay may only mean it is best for us to wait, learning lessons of patience and trust. Luke 1:37

January 14

“In the morning sow thy seed, and in the evening withhold not throe hand: for thou knows not whether shall prosper, either this or that, or whether they both shall be alike good.”- Ecclesiastes 11:6

Telling others about God's loving plan for blessing all the families of the earth is pictured as sowing our seed. We have no way of knowing whether or not those to whom we witness will want to learn more, So we should be prompt to use every opportunity to share the good news and leave the results to the LORD. Matthew 24:14

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January 15

“To everything there is a season.”- Ecclesiastes 3:1

Just as we see there are times for the different seasons of nature, and a time for work as well as a time for play, we also realize God has put this principle into practice on an even greater scale. Now is the time for his human family to learn about the results of evil and of living without God's laws of righteousness. Ecclesiastes 8:6

January 16

“There is ... a time to every purpose under the heaven.”- Ecclesiastes 3:1

The time for all people to learn of God's true character of wisdom, justice, love and power, and about his loving plan for blessing all mankind, will be when Christ's kingdom is reigning on earth. Zephaniah 3:9

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January 17

“See, with he [God], that thou make all things according to the pattern shown to thee.”- Hebrews 8:5

God commanded the people to build a Tabernacle in the wilderness, and he directed all the details. Everything had to be performed exactly as he instructed, down to the very smallest item. This was because the Tabernacle and its services pictured greater and more important things the Divine plan of the ages! Psalms 33:6-9

January 18

“The eyes of the LORD are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers.”-1 Peter 3:12

Believing in Jesus as our Redeem, and giving our hearts to God brings us the privilege of going to our Heavenly Father in prayer, knowing he will always hear us. Jesus' followers are called righteous because Jesus covers their imperfections with his righteousness. Although God does not promise to remove every unpleasant situation in our lives, he will be with us and give us the necessary strength to endure. Daniel 10:2

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January 19

"I will both lay me down in peace and sleep; for thou, LORD, only makes me to dwell in safety."- Psalms 4:8

When we trust in God and do his will as best we can, we can go to sleep each night, knowing he will not let anything happen to us which is not for our good. This is a wonderful blessing to have, and how loving God is to care for us in the way he does. John 14:27

January 20

"The peace of God, which passes all understanding shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."- Philippians 4:7

By our belief in his Son we become precious to God, and his watch-care and keeping are greater than that of any other power or person. Knowing the Almighty Creator is with us, protecting us when we have need, is a comfort. This peace is in our hearts, and comes from leaning not on ourselves, but on God. It keeps us free from worry and fear. Isaiah 26:3

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January 21

“Redeeming the time, because the days are evil.”- Ephesians 5:16

To redeem means ‘to rescue from loss. We are to use our time wisely, and not waste it. There are So many ways we can spend our time, and after we have spent it, it is gone. One question we can ask ourselves is: “Will I be better off if I apply my time in this way, or is there a better way I could put it to use?” Psalms 90:12

January 22

“For this cause came I [Jesus] into the world.”- John 18:37

The first judgment day was in Eden when Adam was tested and failed to be obedient. His punishment was death. Ever since, the human family has all been dying, as part of that penalty. Jesus came to earth and gave his life to release all from that punishment. 1 Corinthians 15:22

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January 23

“The grass withers, the flower fades; but the Word of our God shall stand forever.”- Isaiah 40:8

We see the beautiful grass and flowers come up in the spring and die in the winter. This happens every year as the seasons change. But the words God has given us in his Book, the Bible, will never die or vary. God has always been the same: wise, loving, just, and strong - and he will be that way forever. 1 Peter 1:25

January 24

“Moses. .. said Who is on the LORD’S side? ... And all the sons of Levi gathered themselves together unto him.”- Exodus 32:26

God must have been pleased to have the tribe of Levi step forward and say they were on his side. He is pleased in this age when a person steps forward and dedicates his or her life to serving him. This is called consecration. Proverbs 23:26

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January 25

“There is a way that seems right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death.”- Proverbs 16:25

We cannot know by ourselves what is right and what is wrong. We must look to God for guidance. As we know how long an inch is by holding it up to a ruler to measure, So we know which are God's ways and which are Satan's by measuring them with Jesus' examples and the teachings from the Bible. Jeremiah 21:8

January 26

“Many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt.”- Daniel 12:2

Over and over in the Bible there are refer to a resurrection from death. Jesus pictured this when he brought a few individuals back to life during his first presence. In the kingdom, all who have died will come to life again. For the first time, without Satan's influence, they will have a chance to learn God's ways. Isaiah 35:10

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January 27

“What is man? ... Thou modest him to have dominion over the works of thy hands. “ - Psalms 8:4,6

At his creation man was made king over the earth. He had dominion over the lower animals. All this was lost when he was disobedient in Eden. But in Christ's kingdom, all the good things God planned will come about: there will be no dangerous animals then, and, even more importantly, all people will learn to trust and love one another. Isaiah 35:9

January 28

“The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God.”- Psalms 14:1

From the standpoint of reason alone, when we see the immensity of creation, its beauty, order, harmony, balance, proportion, and diversity, can we doubt there is a Creator? Effects are produced by causes. How shortsighted are those who boast of human skill and intelligence while attributing to mere chance the uniformity and harmony of nature. The proof of God's workmanship is all around us. Psalms 139:14

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January 29

“As the heavens are higher than the earth, So are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts higher than your thoughts.”- Isaiah 55:9

God’s thoughts are better than ours- they are always clear, reasonable, just, loving, and wise. Because of this, we can trust him at all times. We know that although God is much greater than we are, he loves us, and is always ready to listen to our prayers, through which he gives us the strength we need to endure our experiences. Romans 8:28

January 30

“Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof.”- Matthew 6:34

We should take no anxious, worried thought about tomorrow. If we do what we can for ourselves and any who are dependent upon us, trusting in the LORD to provide the things needful, we will have no cause to worry. Anxiety about tomorrow will only add to today’s burden. Matthew 10:31

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January 31

“Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth.”- Ecclesiastes 12:1

No matter how young we may be, we can start developing our relationship with God. We can praise and thank him for our blessings for the beauty we see around us everywhere. In our prays we can tell him we love him. We can study his Word at home and in meetings with others who also love God. If we do these things, our lives will be blessed. Ephesians 6:7

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February 1

“Be ye holy.”-1 Peter 1:16

To be holy is to be godlike, to have a disposition or character like God's. Holiness is not something we achieve; it is only the presence of God in our lives which can make us holy. Thus, the more we allow our minds and affections to be filled with God's goodness, the more his presence in our lives makes us holy. 1 Thessalonians 4:7

February 2

“To him that overcomes will I give to eat of the tree of life which is in the midst of the paradise of God.”- Revelation 2:7

In the first book of the Bible we learn that Adam and Eve were put out of the Garden of Eon because of their disobedience to God's will. In the last book of the Bible, we learn these will come a time when those who are obedient will be able to eat from the tree of life, and the earth will then be a paradise. Revelation 22:2

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February 3

“We shall not find any occasion against this Daniel, except we find it against him concerning the law of his God.”- Daniel 6:5

What an example Daniel was! The only fault his fellowman could find in him was the way in which he served God How wonderful it would be if our friends and neighbors could say this about us, that our greatest fault would be that we tried to please God at all times. 2 Peter 2:20

February 4

“Moses said unto the people, Fear ye not, stand still and see the salvation of the LORD, which he will show to you today.”- Exodus 14:13

When we have tilled our best to solve the problems that come up, or to make decisions which are required, sometimes we must learn to stop, stand still and look to the Heavenly Father for his answers. His wisdom is So much greater than ours. Lamentations 3:26

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February 5

"I [Jesus], if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me."-John 12:32

As a result of our Lord's having been lifted up to his death on the cross, and later resurrected, he will eventually draw all mankind to himself. This drawing means that all will be given a knowledge of the LORD and his purposes. Jesus does not exercise this drawing power now, for those who come to him in this age are drawn by the Father. 1 Timothy 2:4

February 6

"Saith the LORD, I will put my Law in their inward parts, and write it in their hearts."- Jeremiah 31:33

The Law given to the Israelites by God through Moses at Mount Sinai was written down for the people to learn. But they were not able to keep it perfectly because they were imperfect. In the kingdom, God will make a New Covenant with Israel; Christ will be the king. Then all will be able to carry out God's perfect law, for they will have become perfect, and will gain everlasting life. Hebrews 10:16

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February 7

*"The Law [is] a shadow of good things to come."-
Hebrews 10:1*

A shadow is a picture of its owner; it reflects what its possessor is doing. God's 'shadows' are illustrations of what he intends to do at a later date. For instance, the Law Covenant was a shadow, or picture, of what Christ and the church will accomplish in the Millennial Age. Galatians 3:24"

February 8

"Our Father, which art in heaven."- Luke 11:2

Jesus' disciples had asked him to teach them to pray. He gave them this simple prayer as an example. First, we must remember that God is our loving Father in heaven, whose name is holy, and whom we always think of with respect and reverence. Psalms 11:4

February 9

"Hallowed be thy name."- Luke 11:2

God's name is holy and we should have reverence, respect, love, and awe for him. The Bible says Jesus showed us the glory of God, and we should do this also. We honor him as our Creator and Father when we tell others about his glorious charter and loving plan he has for blessing all who will live according to his laws. Hebrews 11:6

February 10

"Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, as in heaven, So in earth."- Luke 11:2

At the present time, God's will is not being done on earth. But Jesus said we pray for the kingdom, when God will be obeyed on earth as he now is in heaven. Many verses in the Bible tell of this kingdom- the time when God will wipe away everyone's sins, and sighing and crying will pass away, and all will know God and serve him together. Isaiah 11:4-9

February 11

“Give us this day our daily bread.”- Matthew 6:11

When we pray that our Heavenly Father will provide for us our daily bread, we don't mean we just want food for our bodies. We also want food for our hearts and minds. And we know we can obtain this spiritual food from the Bible, the Word of God. Jesus said he was the bread that came down from heaven; his words and example are the spiritual food we seek. John 6:14

February 12

“Forgive us our sins: for we also forgive everyone that is indebted to us.”- Luke 11:4

As we want God's forgiveness when we have done wrong, we must also be forgiving of others' wrongdoing toward us. Holding a grudge from the past puts a barrier between us and God. Mark 11:26

February 13

“Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.”- Luke 11:4

Our Father will never test us beyond that which we are able to bear. We have this assurance that he will be with us in every time of need; we are never alone if we have given our hearts to him. It is a comfort to know the Creator of the universe cares for us and has promised to be with us always. 1 Corinthians 10:13

February 14

“I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.”- Philippians 3:14

The Bible says Christians are running a race, and the mark toward which we aim is perfect love. We are to love God and his righteousness; we are to love our fellow runners; and finally, we are to love even our enemies. If we can do this we will receive the prize of the high calling, sharing in Jesus' glory and work. Romans 2:6,7

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February 15

“Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart.”- Psalms 37:4

It isn't enough to do what is right because we have to; we are to be happy doing it, to delight in doing it! The heart that is constantly looking for Divine direction is always in the attitude of prayer. If what we ask for is in harmony with God's will for us, our desires will be granted. Psalms 40:8

February 16

“He shall cover thee with his feathers.”- Psalms 91:4

Have you ever watched a mother hen with her brood of chicks? She watches over each one with such wader care, and at the first sign of danger, sends out a call to them. They quickly run to her and feel safe under the protection of her wings. What a lovely illustration this is of the protecting care of our LORD. We are safe from all danger, while wider his wings. Psalms 17:8

February 17

“There shall be showers of blessing.”- Ezekiel 34:26

Often the love of our family and friends, food to eat, the shelter of home, the rain and sunshine, and the comfort of God’s Word are blessings we take for granted. In this age, many have few of such advantages. In the Millennial Age, God will send these favors abundantly to all, including, eventually, the blessing of life to all who are willing and obedient. Malachi 3:10

February 18

“Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness.”- Matthew 6:33

Because God knows the things of this world give us only temporary pleasure, he instructs us to spend our time, energy, and effort on things concerned with the kingdom of God. It is more important to build a Christian character than to have a lot of worldly possessions. Matthew 22:37

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February 19

"The earth abides forever."- Ecclesiastes 1:4

God has assured us that our planet Earth will always be here. It will never be blown up, burned up or completely destroyed in any manner. Since God prepared the earth as a home for mankind, in due time it will be brought to a condition of perfection, and perfected mankind will live on it forever. Isaiah 45:18,19

February 20

"Blow great are his signs! And how mighty are his wonders! His kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and his dominion is from generation to generation."- Daniel 4:3

As the explanation to King Nebuchadnezzar's vision, God told Daniel that four successive universal kingdoms would be set up to rule. Each of them would fall, until God established the next worldwide kingdom, which would never be destroyed. This final one will be God's kingdom. 2 Peter 1:1

February 21

“The eyes of the LORD are in every place, beholding the evil and the good.”- Proverbs 15:3

God, our Creator, is a great and powerful spirit being. His angels are called watchers, and holy ones, and through them God is aware of all people and all things. He knows not only our words and actions, but even our thoughts. When Ananias and Saphira thought to deceive him, he was not deceived, and they were punished. Acts 5:1-5

February 22

“God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness.”- Genesis 1:26

Man was created in the image of God, which means that man, like God, has a mind, a memory, and ability to plan and to reason. It also includes the fact that Adam had rulership or dominion over the earth, as God has over the universe. He lost this right as king, but it will be restored in the Millennial Age. Matthew 19:4

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February 23

“Grace be unto you, and peace, from God our Father and from our Lord Jesus Christ.”-1 Corinthians 1:3

The apostles often expressed this wish ~ prayer when they wrote to members of the churches. Grace means ‘favor’, and sometimes ‘graciousness’. When the Apostle Paul prayed that God’s gracious favor and blessing of peace would be granted to the Christians at Corinth, his wards showed how much he loved his fellow- Christians. 2 Thessalonians 1:2

February 24

“Bring me an offering of every man that gives it willingly with his heart.”- Exodus 25:2

The Israelites had few worldly goods while they were slaves in Egypt. But when God asked them to give what they had to build the Tabernacle, including the valuable gold and jewels the Egyptians had given them when they left Egypt, they willingly gave more than was needed. Eventually God asked them to bring no more! What a good example for us to follow! 2 Corinthians 9:7

February 25

“Think on these things.”- Philippians 4:8

The Apostle Paul tells us to think about what is true, honest, just, pure, lovely, and of good report. We think of God and our dear Lord, Jesus who are all of these things. As we consider their love for us, and the wonderful plan of salvation, our hearts respond with love and praise. Malachi 3:16

February 26

“These six things doth the LORD hate; yea, seven are an abomination unto him: A proud look.”- Proverbs 6:16,17

Everything we have comes from the LORD; without him we would not exist. Even when we do what is right, we are only doing what we should be doing out of thankfulness to our God who gave us life. The opposite of pride is humility. There is no reason for a proud look when we humbly realize how good Christ was, and how much less we do than we ought. Jeremiah 13:15

February 27

“God doth hate “a lying tongue. “- Proverbs 6:16,17

How carefully we should guard our mouths, lest words slip out that are not true. When we hear ourselves saying things that are exaggerations, or wholly false, we should correct them immediately. We may need to do this many times before we are able to keep from exaggerating or saying untrue things. Psalms 119:29

February 28

*“God doth hate “hands that shed innocent blood.”-
Proverbs 6:16,17*

None of us would be guilty of this action, which is an abomination and hateful to God. However, there is another way in which we might be guilty of causing great injury to people. Talking about others' faults can damage their reputation. Anything harmful to others is best not talked about. Isaiah 1:15

February 29

“God doth hate a “heart that devises [plans] wicked imaginations.” - Proverbs 6:16-18

Some people often seem to be stirring up trouble and are never happier than when others are upset. Elsewhere in the Bible we are told it is not good to be a busybody, speaking things which we ought not. But there are a few unhappy individuals who spend time planning to do things of which they would be ashamed if they were revealed. Romans 1:21

March 1

“God doth hate “feet that be swift in running to mischief.”- Proverbs 6:16- 18

Even if no one finds out about our mischief, there is nothing that can be hidden from God. Nothing can really be done in secret, for the Bible says we are a spectacle to the angels. They are watching us, and God and Jesus know what we are doing and saying. A clear conscience is a lovely thing to have. Isaiah 59:7

March 2

“God doth hate “a false witness that speaks lies.”- Proverbs 6:16-19

We may get attention, and feel important, by telling something about another person which is not exactly true. Perhaps it is only a bit of an exaggeration, not an outright lie. Actually, if it is not wholly the truth, it is a lie! The little bit of notice we receive by telling some gossip, or reporting something in a slanted way, is in no way worth the hours of guilty feelings we have, and the knowledge that what we said was wrong. Exodus 20:16

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March 3

“God doth hate him “that sows discord (disagreement) among brethren.”- Proverbs 6:16-19

This scripture could apply to our brethren in the church, or in our families. To sow discord, which causes fighting and unhappiness, is displeasing to God. It is best to spend our time with those who are looking for good in others, and being an example of love, rather than pointing out others' faults. Philippians 2:14

March 4

“After that John was put in prison, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the Gospel of the kingdom of God, and saying The kingdom of God is at hand, repent ye and believe the Gospel.”- Mark 1:14,15

John's mission was to prepare the people of Israel to receive their Savior. When John was imprisoned, Jesus began his ministry, which was to preach the Gospel of the coming kingdom of God, and open the way to the high calling, or heavenly reward. John 1:29

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March 5

“He ordained twelve, that they should be with him, and that he might send them forth to preach.”- Mark 3:14

The twelve men chosen to be Jesus' apostles were: Simon Peter, James, John, Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James, Thaddaeus, Simon the Canaanite, and Judas Iscariot. Later Paul was chosen by God to replace unworthy Judas. There were never any more substitutions, nor did others take their places when these apostles died. Luke 6:13-16

March 6

“See that ye walk circumspectly (carefully) ... understanding what the will of the LORD is.”- Ephesians 5:15,17

Understanding God's will for us takes continual study of his Word, and good mental perception under the control of a heart in full harmony with truth and righteousness. We should seek God's help through prayer when we strive to know the difference between truth and error, right and wrong. Luke 12:34

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March 7

“Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life.”- Proverbs 4:23

Since the heart is the center of life, both natural and spiritual, if it ceases to work, death will follow. The heart pictures our will and affections. We should try to be active in love, and cultivate thoughts and sentiments in agreement with God's will. The issues of life, respecting our words and deeds, are guarded and influenced by the heart. Hebrews 2:7,8

March 8

“I am the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and ending, saith the LORD.”- Revelation 1:8

Alpha is the first letter of the Greek alphabet, and Omega is the last. The only direct creation of our Heavenly Father was the Logos- Jesus in his pre-human existence. After God created him, then the Logos created all things through the power of the Heavenly Father. Colossians 1:16,17

March 9

“All things were made by him [the Logos]; and without him was not anything made that was made.”- John 1:3

Almighty God had the Word, or the Logos, help in the creation of all things. It is like an architect and a builder: the architect- God- made the plans and had the power needed; Jesus, the Logos, was the builder. Using God's plans and power, he did the work of creating all things that are in heaven and in earth. Ephesians 3:9

March 10

To interest people in the Bible, we must try to keep ourselves 'out of sight' while giving them the encouraging message of the goodness and righteousness of Jesus, and the harmony and reasonableness of God's plan. Mark 1:17

“Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him.”-1 John 2:15

This may seem contradictory to John 3:16,17, but the love of God spoken of there is a benevolent love, which is very proper for us to have for the world also. “Do good unto all men.”- The love we are not to have for this present world is the desire for its fellowship, its pursuits, and its methods, which are contrary to God and his Spirit. Matthew 6:24

March 12

“A just man falls seven times, and rises up again.”-Proverbs 24:16

March 18

“If a man say, I love God, and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he that loves not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen?”-1 John 4:20

It is easy to say we love those we seldom or never see. The more difficult thing is to act out our love in caring, considerate acts for people we are with constantly. Love is not a feeling. “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with [the] God and the Word was [a] god.”- John 1:1,2

If you have an Emphatic Diaglott, you might look at this scripture in the interlinear, or left- hand side of the page. You will find there the extra words that make this scripture understandable. Jesus was not the Almighty God, but he was a mighty one, a god. Just as an earthly father and son are two separate individuals, So also are God and Jesus; they are, however, united, one, in purpose.”- John 17:21

“The Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.”- John 1:14

Jesus had lived in heaven with his Father, Jehovah, long before he came to earth as the babe in Bethlehem. In heaven he had been called the Logos, which means ‘word’ or ‘speech’. In olden times, kings often had a special person who spoke to the people for them. Jesus was God’s special spokesman, the one who gave to others the messages from God. Romans 1:3

March 22

“He went down with them, and came to Nazareth, and was subject unto them.”- Luke 2:51

Jesus was eager to begin his ministry at the earliest possible moment. Upon learning that under the Law he could not do so until thirty years of age, he went home with his parents. Jesus was only twelve years old at the time, and is an example to us that children can ask questions, and in so doing, may suggest wonderful and powerful answers. Ephesians 6:1

“Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man.”- Luke 2:52

After the manner of Jewish boys, Jesus attended the synagogue and heard the Scriptures read every Sabbath. March 28

“The Son of man is delivered into the hands of men, and they shall kill him; and after that he is killed, he shall rise the third day.”- Mark 9:31

Jesus knew at which Passover he would be put to death, for he understood the prophecies of the Bible. Each year at Passover he taught a lesson about the meaning of it. This time he told his disciples he would be put to death and be brought back to life on the third day. 1 Corinthians 15:4

“What shall be the signs of thy coming [presence] and of the end of the world (age)?”- Matthew 24:3

The word translated coming, in this verse, is the Greek word parousia, which means ‘presence’. So, the question is, What would be the sign of the Lord’s presence? This indicates that it will not be clear to everyone that he has returned, because they will need signs to know for certain. Jesus goes on in this chapter to tell what these many signs are. Luke 21:7

March 30

“All the promises of God in him are yea, and in him Amen, unto the glory of God.”- 2 Corinthians 1:20

The Greek word translated yea means ‘a strong yes’, ‘truly’, ‘surely’. The word Amen means ‘firm’ or ‘trustworthy’, ‘surely’, or ‘so be it’. These are two strong words which tell us that God’s promises are absolutely true, and firm, and sure of fulfillment- not wavering nor uncertain. This means we can have full confidence in him at all times. Isaiah 55:11

Isaiah 40:26

Jesus “was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, being forty days tempted of the Devil.”- Luke 4:1,2

After Jesus received the Holy Spirit, he could understand clearly God's purpose in sending him to earth. Satan tempted him to use the power of God for selfish purposes: to satisfy his hunger, to rule the world without having to die, and to use a dramatic way of showing people he was God's Son. April 4

"Behold the Lamb of God!"- John 1:36

God uses picture language throughout the Bible. Here he calls Jesus a lamb. Lambs are obedient, and they look to their shepherds to lead and care for them. Let us try to live our lives in the way Jesus would, as nearly as possible. We take our lessons from what he said and did and learn from the instructions he gave us through the apostles' writings, trying to call attention to Jesus, and not to ourselves. 1 Peter 1:12

“Since by man (Adam) came death, by man [Jesus] came also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even So in Christ shall all be made alive.”-1 Corinthians 15:21,22

Sin and death came to the human race because of the disobedience of Adam. Death is an enemy, not a friend. Because of the ransom sacrifice given by Jesus, our Savior, all people will be raised from death in due time. John 11:25

April 6

“The LORD hath sought him a man [David] after his [God’s] own heart.”-1 Samuel 13:14

Although David had weaknesses and imperfections of character, his heart’s desire was to serve and glorify God. When he made some very serious mistakes, he was sorry for them, repented with his whole heart, and tried to live up to God’s high ideals. David wrote many of the Psalms, and among his words are, “The LORD is my shepherd,” and, “The heavens declare the glory of God.”- Acts 13:22

"I have glorified [honored] thee on earth: I have finished the work which thou gave me to do."- John 17:4

Jesus showed God's power and goodness to the people in miracles and in truth. He had gathered a few hundred to himself, witnessing to them of God's greatness. Then he knew it was time to give his human life as an equal, or corresponding price, a ransom to buy back the perfect life Adam had lost in the Garden of Eden. John 19:30

April 8

"Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified. He is not here: for he is risen, as he said."- Matthew 28:5,6

Although Jesus had told his disciples and friends in different ways that he would die and then be resurrected, they did not understand, for they expected him to become the ruler of the Jews at that time. They did not yet understand God's plan, nor the fact that Jesus had come to earth for this very purpose: to buy back the perfect life Adam lost through disobedience. Matthew 17:23

April 9

"I have no pleasure in the death of him that dies saith the LORD God: wherefore, turn yourselves, and live ye."- Ezekiel 18:32

God wants all people to live! That is why he sent Jesus, and why he has planned a resurrection from the dead. At that time, the requirements will be a renewed heart, a right spirit toward God, full obedience to him; and the assistance from him to accomplish this will be available to all. 1 Timothy 2:4

April 10

"If I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again."- John 14:3

Jesus told his disciples he would return to heaven to be with his Father, but he would come again to prepare for his kingdom. This does not mean he would become a man again, because he gave his flesh, or human life, for the world He will forever be a spirit being, and as such will carry out all his Father's plans. 1 Corinthians 2:9

“Consider him that endured such contradiction of sinners against himself, lest ye be wearied and faint in your minds.”- Hebrews 12:3

Let us think carefully about Jesus, the Son of God, who, though perfect, was opposed and insulted by many evil people. Yet he was always kind and generous to those who opposed him. He never tired of well- doing and patience. What an example to us! Galatians 6:9

April 12

May they all “be one; as thou, Father; art in me, and I in thee.”- John 17:21

Jesus prayed that his followers might all be of the same spirit, working for the same goals, with the same hearts' desires he and his Father shared. This scripture clearly indicates Jesus is God's dear Son, and not that he is God. The idea of the text is clearer if we substitute the word alike for one. As God and Jesus are alike in spirit and purpose, we are to be like them. John 10:38

Jesus "arose and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, Peace, be still. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm."- Mark 4:39

Jesus and his disciples were on a ship crossing the Sea of Galilee, where storms blow up quite suddenly at times. The disciples became frightened. Jesus told the wind and the sea to become calm, and they obeyed him! This pictures his coming kingdom, when Jesus will bring all trouble to an end- there will be no more wars, no more sickness, nor sorrow. Psalms 89:9

April 14

"Hosanna: Blessed is the king of Israel that comes in the name of the LORD."- John 12:13

A great number of Jews rejoiced that Jesus would be their king! But they did not understand he must die first, and be raised from death, nor that his kingdom of peace would not come for many centuries. However, all will rejoice in their hearts when Jesus is indeed king- not only the Jews, but all peoples of earth. This is why Christians pray, "Thy kingdom come." Psalms 72:17

“Whatsoever a man sows [plants], that shall he also reap [gather in].”- Galatians 6:7

In this age, every thought, word, or deed of a consecrated Christian has a bearing on whether or not he will receive a heavenly reward of everlasting life. A loving character, or a petty one, reaped - a kind character, or an envious one, reaped- etc., will be the same character as has been sown by the individual during the trial period of his lifetime. Proverbs 11:18

April 16

“If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another’s feet. For I have given you an example.”- John 13:14,15

April 18

When Jesus was killed, his disciples were shocked and afraid although Jesus had told them many times he would be killed and then raised to life on the third day. Afterward, they were able, by the power of the Holy

“Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.”- John 15:13

Jesus’ friends were all the human race. Jesus agreed with God to lay aside all that he had in heaven, and to have his life- principle transferred to the baby born

in Bethlehem. He consented to become a human being and to willingly give up that perfect human life to pay the price for the life Adam lost through disobedience in the Garden of Eden. Ephesians 5:2

April 21

In his pre- human life, Jesus had always been obedient, “daily his Father’s delight.”- (Proverbs 8:30) But now he was to learn what it meant to be obedient under adverse conditions, and he proved his loyalty to the Father’s will by complete obedience in spite of the opposition of his enemies. The earthly body of flesh suffered death, sacrificed on behalf of the world. “My flesh I give for the life of the world.”- (John 6:51) As a divine spirit being, he is higher and greater than even the angels, and will remain So forever. Luke 24:7

April 24

“Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time.”-1 Timothy 2:6

God's law is very exact: an eye for an eye; a tooth for a tooth; a life for a life. (Deuteronomy 19:21) A perfect human being had to be given in exchange for Adam, who disobeyed God. "God So loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." - John 3:16

God showed his great love for the people of the world by sending his dearly loved Son to be their Redeemer or Savior. Christians believe in Jesus now, and do their best to follow his example. APRIL 27

“They were all filled with the Holy Ghost (Spirit) and began to speak with other tongues.”- Acts 2:1-4

“All wept, and bewailed her: but he said, Weep nor; she is not dead, but sleeps.”- Luke 8:52

Because Jesus gave his life as a ransom- price to buy back the life forfeited by Adam's disobedience, all those who sleep in death will awaken in the resurrection. Jesus woke this little girl from death as a picture of the general resurrection of all mankind in the coming kingdom. John 11:11-14

"He is not here, but is risen." - Luke 24:6

When some of the women disciples of Jesus visited his tomb early on the third day following his crucifixion, they were met by two angels who gave them the wonderful message that Jesus had been raised to life! Although Jesus had been raised a spirit being, he appeared in human form So his disciples could see him and know he had been resurrected. 1 Corinthians 15:4

June 6

"In the day that thou eats thereof (margin, dying) thou shall surely die." - Genesis 2:17

Adam and Eve did not drop dead within the twenty- four hour period after they ate the forbidden fruit, but the dying process did begin immediately. After they were sent out of the Garden of Eden, away from the perfect conditions which sustained their perfect lives, they lived for many hundreds of years, although losing vitality all during that time. Romans 5:12

“Speak evil of no man.”- Titus 3:2

Speaking evil of a person is very much like stealing, because it robs him of his good name and reputation, which are more precious than treasure. Once an evil report has been spoken, there is no way to take it back. But thinking before speaking gives us time to decide if our words would be helpful and encouraging, or better left unspoken. July 14

“Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.”- James 4:7

When the devil tempted him, Jesus quickly said, “Get thee behind me.”-It is very important that Christians follow this example, making a positive and prompt decision to resist the suggestion of evil. Ephesians 4:27

“Our friend Lazarus sleeps; but I go, that I may awake him out of sleep.”- John 11:11-14

Joseph's brothers spoke of killing him, but instead they sold him as a slave, and told their father a wild ani- Malachi had killed him. Many years later, when they met Joseph again, he was neither angry nor bitter with them, especially when he learned how sorry they were for what they had done. He knew God had sent him to Egypt to collect the grain that would save many lives, including his brothers and his father. Genesis 45:5

“The fruit of the Spirit is love.”- Galatians 5:22

Jesus compared himself to a vine and his people to the branches which are expected to bring forth fruit the development of heart and character. One of these fruits is love. The Greek word here translated love is agape. This is the highest kind of love- love that does not have to be earned and is unconditional. We love others as God loves us. John 15:13

July 26

“The fruit of the Spirit is ... joy.”- Galatians 5:22

Joy is cheerfulness, gladness, calm delight. To know God cares for us, to be able to go to him in prayer and be strengthened, guided, and comforted by him, should surely give us this joy. John 15:11

“The fruit of the Spirit is. .. peace.”- Galatians 5:22

Peace is quietness or rest. Knowing God is working out the plan he formed from the beginning of time to make this world a garden paradise for all people, gives us peace of mind- peace which should last even when events in our lives are unhappy. If we have dedicated our lives to God, we are assured that even these unpleasant times are developing our Christian characters. Isaiah 26:3

July 28

“The fruit of the Spirit is ... longsuffering (patience).”- Galatians 5:22

Some of our hardest lessons come in learning to wait patiently; human nature wants what it wants when it wants it! While looking for God to direct our lives, we need to learn patience, waiting to see what opportunities and experiences he has in store for us before making up our minds as to our course of action. As Christians, let us bring every power and talent of mind and body into full subjection to the will of God, rejecting the excessive use of alcohol as a detriment to developing our characters. "The steps of a good man are ordered by the LORD; and he delights in his way."- Psalms 37:23

"We glory in tribulations also, knowing that tribulation works patience." - Romans 5:3

How can we be happy to have problems and trials? Only by knowing that as we endure, or solve our problems in Christlike ways, we develop Christian character. A plaque we often see reads, "LORD, give me patience, and give it to me right now!" This sounds as if patience were a gift. However, for most of us, it is developed by years of trusting in God through our many experiences. Matthew 5:11

August 14

"Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her." - Luke 10:42

Jesus spoke these words to Martha when she complained that Mary was not helping her serve the food, but was sitting at Jesus' feet, learning from him. This verse shows us that we need to take whatever opportunities we have to learn of Jesus- that this is more important than the cares of daily living. Proverbs 23:12

“The Son of man (Jesus) is come to seek and to save that which was lost.”- Luke 19:10

What was lost? When he disobeyed God, Adam lost his life as well as human perfection and a paradise home here on earth. These will be restored during, and by, the millennial reign of Christ, for they have been purchased back- saved- by our Redeemer. John 3:17

August 16

“Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped.”- Isaiah 35:5; 29:18

When Christ's kingdom is in operation on earth, no one will be blind, nor deaf, nor handicapped in any other way. Everyone will be able to understand God's laws of righteousness and goodness, to which So many are blind' and 'deaf now, because they cannot understand. Isaiah 29:18

“Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over With the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again.”- Luke 6:38

“Unto Timothy, my own son in the faith: Grace, mercy and peace, from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord.”-1 Timothy 1:2

Paul loved Timothy as a son and a brother, for they shared a deep faith in God and Jesus. In this letter Paul prayed that Timothy would have God's favor, and that God would deal kindly with him, giving him the peace that comes only from serving God to the best of our ability, knowing he is working in our lives. 2 Timothy 1:2

“This is the day which the LORD hath made; we will rejoice and be glad in it.”- Psalms 118:24

August 20

“How much better it is to get wisdom than gold! and to get understanding rather ... than silver!”- Proverbs 16:16

Obtaining a knowledge of God's perfect character of wisdom, justice, love, and power, and his plan for all the world of mankind, is far more important than gaining much money. Proverbs 3:13,14

“When the Son of man [Jesus] comes, shall he find faith on the earth? “- Luke 18:8

The fact that few people in the world today believe in the Bible is no surprise! Jesus foresaw this very condition and foretold it. That will happen in the kingdom, when God will write his laws in the hearts of the people. Ezekiel 38:20

August 22

“If thou LORD, should mark (count) iniquities, O LORD, who shall stand? But there is forgiveness with thee, that thou may be feared [reverenced].”- Psalms 130:3,4

We are grateful to have the LORD'S assurance that if our hearts are in the right condition, and if we daily ask for forgiveness of our shortcomings, he will not count our failures against us. Psalms 32:5

"I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ."- Romans 1:16

The Gospel of Christ- the truths about God's love for mankind, and his plans for them- is So wonderful the Apostle Paul was very glad to tell it to all who would listen. He was not ashamed to do So because Gospel means 'good news'. Nothing we could give to or do for our friends would be as good as sharing this good news. 2 Timothy 1:8

August 24

"Thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind."- Matthew 22:37

Jesus said this is the greatest of the commandments. If we love God more than everything else, we will want to do those things that please him. We will try to be unselfish, help and care for others, study and share his Word, and try to live our lives as nearly as possible as Jesus lived his. Deuteronomy 6:5

“Who is So faithful among all thy servants as David?”-1 Samuel 22:14

It is said that David was a man after God’s own heart. If you read the Book of Psalms, you will understand why. David often wrote words of praise and love for God and his wonderful creation. David appreciated God’s greatness, giving him glory, honor, and praise. 1 Samuel 18:12

August 26

“He that loves not knows not God; for God is love.”-1 John 4:8

The Greek word used here for love is agape. This kind of love is unconditional; it does not have to be deserved. God loves because it is part of his character to do so. There are other words used in the Bible which mean other kinds of love- duty love; love for a friend; or romantic love. But agape is the best; you just love, no matter what the other person does. 1 John 4:20

August 27

“Now abides faith, hope, charity [love], these three; but the greatest of these is charity.”-1 Corinthians 13:13

The word used here for love is the same as in yesterday's text: it is undeserved love, unconditional, agape love. Although faith in God and hope in his promises are essential, without love they would be of little benefit. Mark 12:30,31

August 28

“Jesus said unto them [his disciples], How many loaves have ye? Go and see. And when they knew, they say, Five, and two fishes.”- Mark 6:38

Jesus' miracles always pictured the blessings to come in his kingdom when he will feed and satisfy the needs of all the people on earth. A miracle is an act that could only be performed by the power of God. How else could they feed five thousand men, women and children with only five loaves of bread and two fish? Matthew 14:17

August 29

"If we suffer [with Christ], we shall also reign with him."-2 Timothy 2:12

If it is our earnest desire to reign with Christ in his kingdom, we know we must prove our faithfulness by being tested. These testings are intended to help us develop character, and to prove our love for and obedience to our Heavenly Father and his Son, Jesus. 2 Peter 4:13

August 30

"Ye are my witnesses, saith the LORD, that I am God."- Isaiah 43:12

God gave many promises to Israel, some of which have already been fulfilled, and others yet to come. One set of promises which has been fulfilled during this twentieth century is that the Jews would return to their land and once more become a nation. Israel has truly become a witness to God's faithfulness in fulfilling promises - proving that he is God. Isaiah 44:8

“Keep yourselves in the love of God.”- Jude 21

This suggests two thoughts: God's love for us, and our love for him. We keep ourselves in his love and show our appreciation of his love for us by studying his Word, praying to him, and trying to please him in everything we do or say. He showed his love for us by the gift of his beloved Son. 1 Timothy 4:10

September 1

“Cause me to hear thy lovingkindness in the morning; for in thee do I trust: cause me to know the way wherein I should walk; for I lift up my soul unto thee.”- Psalms 143:3

Let us start each day by thinking of God's goodness, asking him to show us what is right. We will then be able to give thanks to him for all that happens to us and for the lessons we learn. At the close of the day we will feel that we tried to do our best with his help. Psalms 5:3

September 2

“He hath showed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God.”- Micah 6:8

To do justly: doing to others as we would they should do to us. To love mercy: showing compassion, kindness, and understanding to others. To walk humbly with thy God: keeping our minds teachable, recognizing the greatness of God and our own littleness. Deuteronomy 10:12

“Behold, we count them happy which endure [or hold out]. Ye have heard of the patience of Job that the LORD is very pitiful, and of tender mercy.”- James 5:11

The prophets of the LORD are examples of patient suffering. Job continued to trust in God even though he had great trouble and sorrow. God let Satan test Job's faithfulness by taking away everything except his life. Eventually his health was restored, and he regained even more than he had lost. Romans 5:3

September 4

“Put them in mind to be subject to principalities and powers, to obey magistrates, to be ready to every good work.”- Titus 3:1

Unless the laws of our government are against the laws of God, we are to obey them. As Christians we are not to take part in civil disobedience or rioting, but are to go quietly about the work God has given us to do: witnessing to his truth and making over our lives to be as nearly like Jesus as possible. Mark 12:17

“This God which works in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure [or purpose].”- Philippians 2:13

From the time we give up to God the doing of things our own way and accept his direction and way of doing things as our own, our lives should begin to reflect these changes. Then we will be able to develop characters more like Christ's and we can share in working out God's wonderful plan. Luke 11:2; Job 30:31

September 6

“Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven.”- Matthew 6:1

At no time has God's will been done on earth by all people, So we know the kingdom for which Jesus taught us to pray is still future. God's prophecies for the past have all been fulfilled, and we know this one, too, will come to pass. John 6:40

“Give us this day our daily bread.”- Matthew 6:11

Jesus told Satan, “Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds out of the mouth of God.”- The spiritual food with which we feed our minds is more important to a Christian than the food with which we feed our bodies. Psalms 103:20

September 8

“Forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.”- Matthew 6:12

These debts or trespasses are our daily personal sins and shortcomings, not the Adamic sin which resulted in death for him and all his posterity. Let us be as quick to forgive others, as we wish forgiveness for ourselves. Luke 11:4

September 9

“Bind them (God’s commandments) upon thy fingers, write them upon the table (tablet) of throe heart.”- Proverbs 7:3

With God’s commandments at our fingertips, our hands would busy themselves doing all they could to further God’s plan. With them written on our hearts, having them clearly and prominently in our minds and affections, how could there be any bitterness or evil in our lives? Deuteronomy 6:6-8

September 10

“No man can come to me except the Father which hath sent me draw him.”- John 6:44

The LORD opens our hearts to receive the truth, but first we must have certain qualities So the Father can draw us. We must be teachable and seeking for him with faith and an open mind; we must have humility and honesty. The love of God touches our hearts So we cannot refrain from praising him at every opportunity. Mark 10:15

“He shall send Jesus Christ, which before was preached unto you.”- Acts 3:20

Jesus went away after his first advent to prepare a place where his followers could be with him. Now he has returned, and although we cannot see him, he is fulfilling the signs of his presence given to us in Matthew, chapter twenty- four. Deuteronomy 18:15

September 12

“God shall send Jesus Christ ... whom the heavens must receive (retain) until the times of restitution of all things, which God hath spoken by the mouth of all his holy prophets since the world began.”- Acts 3:21

David wrote that God would send forth his Spirit and renew the face of the earth. Isaiah wrote the ransomed of the LORD would return. Jeremiah wrote God would bring his people again to their land and cause them to dwell safely. This same message- the dead will be restored to life- is related many times in the Bible. Acts 1:11

"Praise ye the LORD!"- Psalms 146:1

During the Millennial Age, no one will ask another, "Do you know the LORD?" At that time all will know him, from the least to the greatest. September 14

"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me."- John 10:27

Sheep are stubborn creatures; they do not like to be driven, but they will follow where their shepherd leads. So it is with our Good Shepherd, Jesus. He gently leads us, and we love and trust him. We have learned to know his voice or teachings, and to follow him; we will not follow the voice of any other. Our Good Shepherd gave his life for his sheep. John 10:14

“Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever.”- Hebrews 13:8

“One thing I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I can see.”- John 9:25

Human eyes need light in order to see, So God gives us this picture of being able to understand spiritual things. In using the examples and teachings of Jesus for our light, we are able to see or understand spiritual things - our lack of understanding, or blindness, is taken away. Ephesians 5:8

“The LORD hath done great things for us; whereof we are glad.”- Psalms 126:3

Has the LORD done great things for you? It is good to sit quietly and think of all these great things. This will grow as you grow, until with all your heart you will want to follow in the footsteps of Jesus, doing only what is pleasing to him to the best of your ability. Psalms 116:12

September 18

“Being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.”- Romans 5:1

To be justified means to be ‘made right’, or ‘counted as right’. Because of Jesus’ actual righteousness, and our faith in him, God counts us as being righteous. Nothing we could do on our own would accomplish this; it is only because we have Jesus as our savior that we are counted right in God’s eyes. Romans 1:17

“God hath not given us ‘the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.’-2 Timothy 1:7

*“As for me and my house, we will serve the LORD”-
Joshua 24:15*

Joshua had been reminding the Jewish people of many good things God had done for them in the past, and of his decision that he and his family would serve the true God. We cannot force others to serve God, but parents can take the opportunity to set an example and to teach their children about their faith in God and his promises while the children are still young and living in their parents' home. 1 Samuel 12:24

“Whither thou go, I will go.”- Ruth 1:16

Ruth was from Moab, where they worshiped idols, while her mother-in-law Naomi, was a Judean who worshiped the true God. When their husbands died, Ruth's decision to accept Naomi's God and to go to Judea with her, was so positive and permanent it becomes an example of those who decide to follow Christ. God blessed her faithfulness, and she became great-grandmother to King David, an ancestor of Jesus. Acts 21:13

September 22

“God said, Let the earth bring forth the living creatures after his kind.”- Genesis 1:24

No instance is known where one species or kind has changed into another. You can mix black dogs with white dogs; but you cannot mix dogs with cats. Surely, if nature were the creator, or evolver, she would continue the process: species would be constantly changing, not remaining fixed, as they are. The theory of evolution is contrary to human reason, as well as to the Bible. Genesis 1:21

“As by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin, and So death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned.”- Romans 5:12

Death entered the world as the result of Adam's disobedience. Death is not a friend, but an enemy. Only Jesus could satisfy justice on our behalf by giving his perfect life as a corresponding, or equal price for Adam's forfeited life, bringing hope for the future. 1 Corinthians 15:22

September 24

“If any man offend not in word, the same is a perfect man.”- James 3:2

It is hard to control the words which come out of our mouths. Controlling our words will be a battle lasting our whole lifetime and can only be won with God's help and our sincerest efforts. James 3:8

“The fathers have eaten sour grapes, and the children’s teeth are set on edge.” - Ezekiel 18:2

When Adam disobeyed God, he ate the sour grape of sin and he was sentenced to death- his teeth were set on edge. By heredity, all of his posterity have also been subject to death, no matter how good or well intentioned they are. In the Millennial Age, each person will be on trial for his own behavior, Adam’s sentence to death no longer being in operation. Lamentations 5:7

September 26

“The living know that they shall die: but the dead know not anything.” - Ecclesiastes 9:5

When people die they do not know anything, because it is as though they are asleep. They are not alive nor conscious to suffer in a place of torment. It is comforting to have this knowledge. Ecclesiastes 9:10

"They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain."- Isaiah 11:9

Through healing of illnesses and casting out demons, Jesus and the apostles illustrated the coming time when all illness will be healed, and tears wiped from every face. God sometimes used the word mountain to picture a kingdom. This scripture refers to the kingdom of Christ as a holy mountain. Revelation 21:4

September 28

"The earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD, as the waters cover the sea."- Isaiah 11:9

At no time in the past has true knowledge of the LORD, Jehovah God, covered the earth. So far, men have had a multitude of religions. For this reason, we know this verse applies to a future time. Habakkuk 2:14

*“Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks.”-
Matthew 12:34*

Our thoughts are often spoken of as coming from our hearts, the center of our affections. Our minds are filled with whatever we expose them to each day. When we fill them with gossip or trivia, this is what comes out in our words. We are to constantly battle to overcome undesirable character traits, and enlarge on the finer, more uplifting qualities. Luke 6:45

September 30

“Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God.”- Romans 10:17

God has arranged a wonderful network to spread his Word to the people. Each one who understands God's plans and purposes has a responsibility to share this knowledge with others. It is never to be an imposition on others, however. And we are to leave it with God as to whether or not the message prospers. Colossians 1:24

October 2

Satan said, “I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will be like the Most High (God).”- Isaiah 14:14

Satan attempted to set up a kingdom to rival God's future kingdom. When Satan tried to persuade Jesus to worship him, Jesus answered with the scripture: “Thou shalt worship the LORD thy God, and him only shalt thou serve.”- We, too, must be quick to turn to God when false gods try to win our affection and worship. Isaiah 14:13

“Be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods.”- Daniel 3:17,18

The three Hebrews were thrown into the fiery furnace for their refusal to worship a god other than Jehovah. They were sure their God was able to save them, but even if he did not, they would still be his faithful servants, worshiping him alone. Such faith and courage! We do not expect that in every case God will deliver us, but we will trust him even when we cannot trace his actions. 1 Corinthians 1:10

October 4

“To Titus, mine own son after the common faith: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ our Savior.”- Titus 1:4

Thus was the son of Gentile parents. Possibly Paul introduced him to Christianity and loved him as a son. Thus was courageous, resourceful, and completely dedicated to the common faith- the faith shared by all of Jesus' followers. Philemon 3

October 5

“Before it came to pass I showed it [to] thee: lest thou should say, Mine idol hath done them, and my graven image, and my molten image, hath commanded them.”- Isaiah 48:5

So the events of history could not be considered happenstance, God often foretold them to his people. When they came to pass they could see God had foreknown them. In this way, false means of prophecy such as astrology or idols, etc., could not be credited for the acts. Psalms 145:3,4

October 6

“What if some did not believe? Shall their unbelief make the faith of God without effect? “- Romans 3:3

Even though many do not believe in God, it does not mean his plan is not being carried out. God knows the end from the beginning. Nothing can prevent the church from being completed and the kingdom of Christ from being established, bringing blessings to all the families of the earth. Hebrews 4:2

“Take heed that ye do not your alms facts of righteousness] before men, to be seen of them Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. “- Matthew 6:1,2

If we do good deeds in order to bring praise and glory to ourselves, then they are not being done to please God. The praise we get from others is all the reward we will get for them: God will not reward us further. Matthew 6:4

October 8

“It shall come to pass, that before they call, I will answer; and while they are yet speaking, I will hear.”- Isaiah 65:24

God remembers all his people who come to him with humble and repentant hearts. He is merely waiting for us to call out to him for help in our times of difficulty and need, with willing hearts to accept his provisions for us, knowing they are in our best interest. Matthew 6:8

“Lead me in thy truth, and teach me: for thou art the God of my salvation. “- Psalms 25:5

In this age, God is leading only a little flock into the truth, offering them salvation through the ransom paid by his dear Son. In the Millennial Age, through Christ and his little flock, God will have all men to be saved and come to a knowledge of the truth. 1 Timothy 2:4

October 10

“Jesus being full of the Holy Ghost [Spirit] returned from Jordan, and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness.”- Luke 4:1

The word ghost in the text is from the Greek word pneuma. A better translation would be ‘spirit’ or ‘vital principle’. Jesus was filled with God’s Holy Spirit at Jordan. He went into the mountains, away from every distraction, for forty days, to study, to pray, and to meditate on God’s Word. Matthew 4:1

"I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believes in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live."- John 11:25

Since Adam's transgression and sentence, God considers the human race as dead, or dying. What human being ever lived who did not eventually die? And yet, through faith in Jesus' ransom sacrifice, we have the opportunity for everlasting life. So, although we are considered dead, we can all have life through Christ. John 6:40

October 12

"The meek will he guide in judgment: and the meek will he teach his way."- Psalms 25:9

People who are meek are not proud but are humble and patient. Such are ready to learn; they are the ones whom God is ready to teach. Jesus was meek. He was the Son of God, yet he was not proud. Matthew 5:5

“God commends (or proves) his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.”- Romans 5:8

God knows no one is without sin, yet he showed his love for us by sending Jesus, who was obedient unto death, to make possible the opportunity for life to all in due time. 1 Peter 3:18

October 14

“Watch ye and pray, lest ye enter into temptation. The spirit truly is ready, but the flesh is weak.”- Mark 14:38

We do not know in advance what temptations will come to us. As we study and pray we will be better prepared to recognize them when they do come, and stronger to overcome them. Galatians 5:7

“The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life.”- John 6:63

“Blessed are your eyes, for they see: and your ears, for they hear.”- Matthew 13:16

Jesus' disciples were very fortunate because they could understand, see, and hear, what he was teaching. Some people heard his words but did not understand what he meant. Jesus knew those who understood received a blessing, and So he said his followers' eyes and ears were blessed. Luke 10:24

John 14:26*

The men who translated the Bible into English believed the Holy Spirit was a spirit being, or person, So they used the word 'he' when they should have used 'it'. After Jesus died, God used his power to enable the disciples to remember and understand Jesus' teachings. The Holy Spirit is not a person but is the power or influence of God. John 15:26

October 18

"Be sober, be vigilant (watchful); because your adversary (enemy) the devil (Satan), as a roaring lion, walks about, seeking whom he may devour."-1 Peter 5:8

A lion roars when it is ready to attack its prey, frightening the other animal So much it cannot move; then the lion springs on its victim. Satan, too, is very cunning, but he is more subtle and does not attack us with a roar. We need to be watchful So as not to be led away from God. Ephesians 6:11

“Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.”- Matthew 5:48

According to Strong's Concordance, the word perfect means 'complete'. Therefore refers back to the preceding verses, which tell us in what way we can be complete. Just as God gives blessings to the wicked as well as to the good, we are to love our enemies as well as our friends. James 1:4

October 20

“He laid hold on ... Satan, and bound him a thousand years.”- Revelation 20:2

The object of the Millennial Age is to give all mankind a full, fair opportunity to learn of God's plans and purposes. With Satan bound and powerless, deceptions, superstitions, and ignorance will disappear. At the end of the thousand years he will be loosed for a time, allowing him to bring a final test of heart- loyalty to God upon mankind. Revelation 12:9

*“Behold, I create new heavens and a new earth.”-
Isaiah 65:17*

In the kingdom, Christ and the glorified church will be the new heavens, or spiritual control, over the earth. Earth's society will be reorganized under this government on the basis of love and justice, instead of selfishness and oppression. 2 Peter 3:13

October 22

“The former shall not be remembered, nor come into mind.”- Isaiah 65:17

After mankind has been regenerated, or brought to life again, there will be a new arrangement of things- a complete change from present disorder and sin. People will still be able to remember those former things but will discard them as not to be compared favorably with the wonderful earthly arrangements of the kingdom! Isaiah 43:25

October 24

“Everyone that hears these sayings of mine, and does them not, shall be likened unto a foolish man, which built his house upon the sand.”- Matthew 7:26

God's teachings in the Bible are the foundation upon which we build our lives; they are true and never change. But sand shifts, and strong winds can destroy anything built upon it. Let us base our lives on the firm foundation of God's Word, rather than on the creeds and traditions of men. Luke 6:49

Jesus "gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time (the proper time)."-1 Timothy 2:6

Adam was created with a perfect human life. But when he disobeyed God his sentence of death passed on to all people. Worldly pleasures cannot give perfect peace, but the promises of God are sure, and they do bring us peace. Philippians 4:7

"I must work the works of him that sent me."- John 9:4

"Thou art my hope, O LORD God: thou art my trust from my youth."- Psalms 71:5

No doubts or fears can overwhelm us if we trust and lean upon the LORD. He has said he will never leave nor forsake us, So we may boldly say, The LORD is my helper, and I will not fear what men shall do unto me! It is a great blessing to know and love the LORD while we are still young. Jeremiah 17:7

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world: he that follows me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life."- John 8:12

As a beam of light shows a path on a dark night, So Jesus' teachings pictorially enlighten the path a Christian takes in life. Darkness suggests ignorance and evil deeds. If we walk in the light of our Lord's teachings, reflecting this light continually, it will be an example to those in darkness. John 1:9

October 30

Jesus said, "If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples."- John 8:31

If we do things by fits and starts we shall not make much progress. Jesus knew this, and So he advised his disciples to continually think and live according to his teachings. By So doing, they prove they are truly his disciples, followers whose chief desire is to learn from him. Colossians 3:16

“Unto you that fear (reverence) my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings (beams).”- Malachi 4:2

Those who truly reverence Jesus, the Sun of righteousness, will be able to appreciate the beginning, or dawning, of the day when the Messiah will heal, console, forgive, and instruct all the families of the earth, putting an end to sin, pain, sorrow, and death. 1 Peter 1:19

November 1

“The LORD disciplines him whom he loves and chastens every son whom he receives.”- Hebrews 12:6, Revised Standard Version

God disciplines those who follow in Jesus' footsteps, because he cares about them. He knows these chastenings will help us to develop patience, faith, obedience, loyalty, etc. Just as earthly parents do with their children, he teaches and corrects us as his children. Psalms 94:12

November 2

“Lord, teach us to pray.”- Luke 11:1

Prayer is a wonderful privilege. It is important to pray in the right manner; thus the disciples made this request of Jesus. We can come to God with loving hearts and tell him of our desires and hopes, always leaving the results with him. He knows what is best for us, and sometimes says, No, to our requests. Two interesting phrases in the King James' Translation are: 'it came to pass', and 'it shall come to pass'. When we read these phrases, we are reading of the fulfillment of that which God had already foretold. Genesis 9:14

November 4

"He that denies me before men shall be denied before the angels of God."- Luke 12:9

Any who say they are disciples of Christ, but ignore, misrepresent, or deny his teachings, are those to whom this scripture refers. One would not be denying him in this sense, if they had not first claimed to know him and his teachings. 2 Peter 2:1

November 5

“Walk in wisdom toward them that are without (outside the faith), redeeming (buying back) the time.”- Colossians 4:5

We are to use our time carefully, saving as much as we can for prayer and study, which are necessary for growth in our relationship with God. Time is like money- it can be spent only once. Those outside the Christian faith could take up so much of our time with earthly endeavors that none would be left for the things which are so important to a Christian. Ephesians 5:16

November 6

“Whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the LORD, and not unto men.”- Colossians 3:23

If we lack the opportunity to spend our lives teaching others about God, we can still serve him by giving our time and energy to help our brethren in Christ. We can write cheerful, encouraging letters to them; visit those who are sick or isolated; and find other ways to be helpful to them. When we give up things we enjoy doing in order to spend time helping others, God accepts this as our offering to him. 1 Samuel 12:24

“The angel of the LORD appeared to Joseph in a dream, saying, Arise, and take the young child and his mother, and flee into Egypt.”- Matthew 2:13

When King Herod learned that a child had been born who was to become king of the Jews, he tried to destroy Jesus by ordering all children two years old and younger to be killed. God’s plan for Jesus to be the Savior of the world could not be hindered, and he was taken safely out of the wicked king’s reach. Matthew 2:14

November 8

“Men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.”-2 Peter 1:21, Revised Standard Version

God influenced the minds of the prophets to write of things to come. Some prophecies have already been fulfilled, and many others are for a later time. For example: prophecies that the Jews were to be scattered throughout many countries and then return to Israel have had fulfillment; but prophecies that wars will cease are still future. The prophecies of the Bible are fulfilled at the right time. Numbers 12:6

November 9

"In thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed."- Genesis 22:18

An angel gave Abraham this message from God. Who is meant by the seed of Abraham? The Apostle Paul tells us it refers to Christ, and includes those who are his faithful followers in the Gospel Age. The word nations is sometimes translated 'families', assuring us that, in due time, all people will be blessed by Christ and his church. Galatians 3:18

November 10

"We know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose."- Romans 8:28

At present God is dealing only with those who are called according to his purpose- which is the development of the church. So long as they are faithful, the experiences of their lives will be overruled by God to develop in them characters more like our example, Jesus. In Christ's kingdom, all things will work together for everyone's good! 2 Corinthians 4:17

“When I am weak, then am strong.”- 2 Corinthians 12:10

Being weak means recognizing our imperfections and shortcomings. When we are fully loyal to the LORD, we feel these weaknesses keenly. Our strength comes from relying upon God and his dear Son for help and guidance. 2 Corinthians 13:14

November 12

“Children, obey your parents in the LORD: for this is right.”- Ephesians 6:1

Since children need care, guidance, and protection until they are mature enough to have homes of their own, God established families. Parents are not automatically perfect, but most of them care for the needs of their children the best they can. Jesus, also, was subject to his parents while he was growing up. Exodus 20:12

“Ye shall know them by their fruits.”- Matthew 7:16

In the same way that you can tell a tree by the kind of fruit it bears, you can tell what kind of person someone is from the life he leads. As we see how he spends his time and energy, we see whether his life is being spent in the service of God, or in seeking human pleasures. Matthew 7:20

November 14

“Worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness.”- Psalms 29:2

To worship the LORD means to love and praise him, to bow before him with reverence. Holiness is purity and goodness: So we do praise his goodness from our hearts, for we have learned of the beauty of his character. 1 Chronicles 16:29

November 15

“When ye pray, say, Our Father which art in heaven.”- Luke 11:2

Jesus is not telling us we should use these exact words, but rather, to pray ‘in this manner’. We acknowledge God, the Heavenly Father, at the start of each prayer, coming to him with earnest hearts, with thanksgiving, keeping our requests simple and in accordance with his plans and purposes. Matthew 6:9

November 16

“Except ye be converted [changed], and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven.”- Matthew 18:3

Children are candid and open, and live in a world of wonder. As a child trusts his parents, we need to trust God. In this way mature people can have childlike minds, receiving the LORD’S words readily and with simplicity of heart. Mark 10:14

November 17

“Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God.”- James 1:13

Many think their problems come from God. Often our difficulties are of our own making, resulting from pride, weakness, lack of faith, or other shortcomings. When asked, God will help us to overcome evil, or forgive us when we cannot triumph over it, but he does not send evil to us. Proverbs 1:10

November 18

“Who makes thee to differ from another, and what hast thou that thou didst not receive?”- 1 Corinthians 4:7

We all have different talents- some have very special ones, and some quite ordinary. Because of this we differ greatly one from another. We realize we have received these blessings, not by our own wisdom or work, but by the grace of God. We appreciate whatever talents we have, acknowledging that they are from our Heavenly Father. John 3:27

“If ye walk in my statutes, and keep my commandments, ... I will walk among you, and will be your God and ye shall be my people.”- Leviticus 26:3,12

When parents begin raising a family, one of the first things they do is set down some rules So the children will know what is expected of them. That way, everyone will be working together. God gave rules, or laws, to the people of Israel. The most important ones are called the Ten Commandments, but there were many others. Ephesians 2:8

November 20

“All the earth shall be devoured with the fire of my jealousy (zeal). For then will I turn to the people a pure language, that they may ... serve him (God) with one consent.”- Zephaniah 3:8,9

There can be no doubt that this is pictorial language, for should the earth be destroyed by literal fire, there would be no people to whom God could turn a pure language. This scripture foretells the destruction of the world's ungodly institutions. He then will speak plainly and clearly So everyone will know he is God. Psalms 79:5

“Go to the ant, thou sluggard (idle person); consider her ways, and be wise. “- Proverbs 6:6

A little ant might seem an odd thing to consider, but Solomon did not think so. Once a man, alone in a ruined building, watched an ant trying to carry a grain of corn up a wall. He counted the efforts made by the ant and saw the grain fall back down sixty- nine times. On the seventieth try, the ant reached the top. This is our lesson: we should never give up trying to do God’s will. Job 7:12

November 22

“Let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is the fruit of our lips giving thanks to his name.”- Hebrews 13:15

Long ago the Israelites sacrificed bulls, goats, grain, etc., to show their appreciation of God’s favor. We have a different arrangement, but we still offer sacrifices, and praise is one of them. Praising God shows our appreciation of his greatness, and also acknowledges our need of him. Psalms 116:17

November 23

“Oh that men would praise the LORD for his goodness, and for his wonderful works to the children of men!”- Psalms 107:8

So many years after this was written, his mercies and blessings are still taken for granted, and few have time to say, “Thank you, LORD.”- Since we have learned to know our Heavenly Father and to love him, we want to praise him with all our hearts as we accept many, many blessings from his loving hands. Psalms 107:31

November 24

“O give thanks unto the LORD; for he is good: for his mercy endures forever.”- Psalms 136:1

Many feel they have little for which to be thankful. Indeed, there are those who have almost nothing of this world's goods, and those who know nothing of a loving God. We are privileged to know that God has provided a Savior for all, and that the time is coming when everyone will be blessed. Then they will recognize his goodness and mercy, and the broadness of his love. Psalms 106:1

“Faith is the substance of things hoped for.”- Hebrews 11:1

Faith is the real substance, or mental understanding, which stimulates and clears our mind, . We cannot hold it in our hands, or walk on it with our feet, but it becomes strength to our minds as we progress in the knowledge of God. And, as we gain more understanding of God’s promises through study, fellowship, and prayer, our faith increases. Hebrews 10:23

November 26

“Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life.”- John 6:68

Some of Jesus’ followers had left him because they did not understand or appreciate his teachings. When this happened, he asked the apostles if they also would leave him. Peter, realizing Jesus was the Son of God, answered him in the words of our text. We also realize there is nowhere else to turn, and that Jesus’ words lead to eternal life. Hebrews 5:9

November 27

Aaron "shall be thy spokesman unto the people and thou (Moses) shall be to him instead of God."- Exodus 4:16

This is another of God's wonderful pictures for us. Moses here pictures God, and Aaron pictures Jesus. Before he came to earth to be born as a human being, Jesus was the Logos, the 'Word'. The Logos was God's mouthpiece, speaking God's Word to angels and to people, just as Aaron spoke Moses' words to the people of Israel. Exodus 7:1

November 28

"Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us."-1 Corinthians 5:7

The Israelites ate the Passover lamb in their homes, and sprinkled their doorposts and lintels with the blood of the lamb So the angel of death would pass over them. This blood pictured Jesus, the Lamb of God, whose blood is pictorially sprinkled in our hearts So that Adamic death 'passes over' us. Isaiah 53:7

"We are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do."- Luke 17:10

It is our duty to do God's will, because if he had not created us, we would not exist. None of us is indispensable to God, to do his work, or to bring him glory; someone else could just as well do that which we do. The opportunity to work for God is to our advantage- we are the ones who benefit. Romans 3:12

November 30

"The liberal soul shall be made fat: and he that waters shall be watered also himself. "- Proverbs 11:25

To be liberal is to share what we have with others generously- both spiritual and material favors. The more we give to others, the more we are made 'fat', or receive blessings in return. The more we share the messages of truth from the Bible, the more we grow spiritually. 1 Timothy 6:18

December 1

“The steps of a good man are ordered by the LORD: and he delights in his (God’s) way.”- Psalms 37:23

With the LORD by our side, no experience can be considered just lucky or unlucky, because he is directing all the circumstances of our lives. We are free to make our own decisions after seeking his guidance and direction always, as to what his will is for us. Proverbs 16:9

December 2

“He that hath no sword, let him sell his garment, and buy one Lord, behold, here are two swords.”- Luke 22:36,38

Why did Jesus tell the apostles to buy swords? It was necessary for the people to know that his capture was voluntary, not by force, for the apostles could have defended him. Jesus came to earth to give his life for the world- it was not taken from him, or forfeited as Adam’s was. Jesus knew his time had come, and So he went peaceably with his captors. Joel 3:10

December 3

“The LORD had prepared a great fish to swallow up Jonah.”- Jonah 1:17

The story of Jonah is the account of the first submarine ride! It tells us that Jonah prayed to God while in the belly of the fish for three days and three nights. He said, “I will sacrifice unto thee with the voice of thanksgiving,” and the LORD saved Jonah. Psalms 116:17

December 4

“Love ye your enemies, and do good, and lend, hoping for nothing again; and your reward shall be great, and ye shall be the children of the Highest: for he is kind unto the unthankful and to the evil.”- Luke 6:35

It is easy to love people who love us and are kind to us. But God also wants us to love those who are unkind to us, and to help them whenever we have the opportunity. In this way we will be more like our Heavenly Father, who is kind even to the unthankful. Matthew 5:44

December 5

“Jesus ... saw much people, and was moved with compassion toward them, because they were as sheep not having a shepherd.”- Mark 6:34

Sheep without a shepherd can become lost as they wander in search of pasture. They might go in the wrong direction and find no grass or water. Perhaps they would be attacked by wild animals or bitten by snakes. The sheep need a shepherd, and the people need Jesus to teach them and to help them. Jesus is called our Good Shepherd. John 10:14

December 6

“Whatsoever thy hand finds to do, do it with thy might.”- Ecclesiastes 9:10

When Moses said the Israelites would not believe he was sent by God, the LORD asked him, “What is that in thine hand?” God used the staff in Moses’ hand to work miracles, freeing Israel from Egypt. Much later, a woman named Dorcas used needle and thread in her hands to sew garments for the brethren in the church. God does not expect great miracles of us, but to use what we have at hand in serving him. James 2:17

December 7

“As often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do show the Lord’s death till he come.”-1 Corinthians 11:26

The Lord’s Supper is a memorial of his death. When his followers celebrate this memorial they are remembering his death. Jesus’ memorial replaced the Passover, which was celebrated annually on the exact date. When annually we celebrate the memorial, we commemorate the giving of his life for the world. Exodus 13:10

December 8

Paul “is a chosen vessel unto me, to bear my [Jesus] name before the Gentiles.”- Acts 9:15

After Judas killed himself, the remaining apostles chose a replacement So their number would be complete. Their choice was Matthias (Acts 1:23-26), but he is never mentioned again. Paul is spoken of as having been chosen by God, and So we believe it was he who became the twelfth apostle. Each of the other apostles had also been chosen by God, not by men. Jesus spoke of his apostles as having been given him by his Father. Romans 1:1

Bread From Heaven

December 9

“After the way which they call heresy, So worship I (Paul) the God of my fathers.”- Acts 24:14

Heresy is any opinion opposed to official or established and accepted views or doctrines. For those who had been brought up in the traditional Jewish manner, to convert to Christianity meant becoming a heretic - opposed to established religious views. Paul was not ashamed of this. It is no different now; when one differs with established religious groups he may be called a heretic. Romans 1:16

December 10

“All this power will I (the devil) give thee for that is delivered unto me.”- Luke 4:6

Jesus called Satan the prince of this world, and Peter called our age ‘this present evil world’. Within limits, God is allowing Satan to rule in order to give human beings experiences necessary for them to appreciate righteousness in the kingdom. Matthew 4:9

December 11

“Every spirit that confesses not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God, ... (but] is that spirit of antichrist.”-1 John 4:3

Some claim that Jesus was divine while here on earth. This denies his humanity, his flesh. It also contradicts the great suffering that was part of his giving his flesh for the life of the world. Had he been of the divine nature, he could not have suffered and died as a human being, the exact equivalent of perfect Adam before he sinned. 2 John 7

December 12

“The LORD shall utter his voice before his army.”- Joel 2:11

God uses people as his ‘army’ to carry out his purposes. Many of them are unaware, as they set out their own life’s scenes, that God is using them in a much larger drama. Sometimes we hear of the “Force.”- It is reassuring to know there is a force working for good, and that force is God’s power which will eventually triumph over evil. Joel 2:21

December 13

"They were baptized, both men and women."- Acts 8:12

We realize that when we are lowered into the water in baptism that it is a picture of having given up our right to perfect earthly life. When we are raised out of the water it symbolizes our being brought to life again as a new creature. Since a baby could never understand the deep meaning of surrendering his earthly life to eventually gain spiritual life in heaven, we realize that infant baptism is inappropriate. Matthew 28:19

December 14

"Death and hell were cast into the lake of fire."- Revelation 20:14

Fire, meaning destruction in Bible symbology, was one of the most destructive agents known to the ancient world. No one would throw anything into fire to preserve it! The lake of fire is an illustration of complete destruction. When death and hell- the grave- are cast into this lake of fire, they are destroyed forever, and the death that Adam passed on to all his family will be destroyed 1 Corinthians 15:26

December 15

“In the world ye shall have tribulation [troubles or trials].”- John 16:33

Tribulation is from the Latin word tribulum- a thresher that separates the grain of wheat from the chaff, or waste. Christians are pictured by wheat; and the chaff illustrates the old, useless traits of which we need to rid ourselves. So our troublesome experiences are meant to separate the good, the usable, from that which is worthless. Acts 14:22

December 16

“The Law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ.”- Galatians 3:24

The Law Covenant was not made with the whole world, but only with Israel. They, being imperfect, could not keep a perfect Law. Its purpose was to point out their weaknesses, showing them their need for Messiah. At his First Advent, some Jews were prepared to receive him, and for three and a half years after Jesus' death, the Early Church was composed of Jews only. Hebrews 5:9

December 17

*“looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith.”-
He 12:2*

When Jesus was delivered to be crucified for our offenses, he became the author of our faith. He was the finisher because his perfect life, given for us, covers our imperfections and makes our justification possible. We look to Jesus and away from the afflictions and persecutions that may come as a result of our loyalty to him. Haggai 2:9

December 18

*“Yet once more I shake not the earth only, but also
heaven.”- He 12:26*

In the earth, God is picturing mankind. In the heaven, he is picturing religious institutions of our day. God indicates that one last time he will shake society, including the religious institutions, So things not true, not strong enough to stand up under testing, will collapse. In this way he will destroy false religions and harmful systems, making way for a kingdom which cannot be shaken. Exodus 3:13,14

December 19

“You [Israel] only have I known of all the families of the earth.” - Amos 3:2

Until the call of the church was opened to the Gentiles, Israel was the only nation with whom God dealt. This was because they were a typical nation, picturing the Christian church. Their journey through the wilderness pictured the life of the church on earth until it reaches Canaan- heaven. There are many other pictures in the experiences of the nation of Israel. Deuteronomy 7:6

December 20

“Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart.” - Psalms 37:4

To delight in the LORD is a step further than trusting in him. This is when our hearts and affections are centered on him, and we continually look to him for divine direction. He grants the desires of our hearts when they are harmonious with his plans and purposes. Isaiah 58:14

December 21

“Father thou loved me before the foundation of the world.”- John 17:24

Jehovah, and the Logos- Jesus in his prehuman existence- loved one another and did great things together, one of which was the creation of man. When Adam disobeyed, bringing the death sentence to the human family, the Logos willingly came to earth to die So Adam and his posterity could be redeemed from that sentence, and live forever in God’s kingdom. John 17:26

December 22

“Behold, thou shall ... bring forth a son, and shall call his name Jesus; ... and of his kingdom there shall be no end.”- Luke 1:30-33

When God’s first creation, the Logos, was willing to be born as a human, God, through an angel, told Mary she would bear this child. No wonder the angels above the fields of Bethlehem sang praises to God! The birth of the Savior had just been announced- the one who would save all people from the great enemy, death. Genesis 22:18

December 25

“Unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder.”- Isaiah 9:6

Hundreds of years before the Logos left heaven and came to earth, being born as the babe, Jesus, in Bethlehem, Isaiah wrote the prophecy of our text. Jesus came to be the Savior of the world- of all mankind. In due time he will reign as king and will bring blessings to all the people. 1 Corinthians 15:25

December 26

“The Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.”- John 1:14

The Logos, the Word or Jesus, left the spirit plane of existence to become a human being. He did not merely materialize or appear in human form; nor was he sinful, as are all other human beings. He was a perfect man, and, as such, was full of grace and truth, and able to pay the ransom price for all. Matthew 28:18

December 28

"Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."- Matthew 6:21

Those who accept God's invitation to be Jesus' followers look forward to being with him in heaven, as that is where their thoughts and desires are where their treasure is! The rest of the people will, during the kingdom and afterwards, live on the earth; their treasure will be earthly. Matthew 12:35
